Paid Research Opportunities

Undergraduate Research Assistant Work Study

- Undergraduate RAs can apply to potentially receive work study compensation by <u>filling out</u> <u>the FAFSA</u> each year by February and indicating on it that they would like to be considered for Federal Work Study funds.
- *Note: International students are not eligible for Federal Work Study funds and work study funds cannot be received when students are getting course credit for their research involvement (e.g., PSY 273)*

- Interns are required to attend weekly in-person office hours (4 hours per week, intervals of 1-hour minimum)
- Assist with events across campus, and meet with Psychology majors (spring semester)
